National Energy Efficiency Action Plan measures are divided into the following categories:

- **9 horizontal measures** which affects one or more sectors (e.g. Private and public) and/or follows to horizontal measures reflecting the development of the NEEAP in the EU guideline
- **1 building** sector measure, which refers to, Private, commercial and residential buildings;
- **9 public** sector measures, which will be implemented by central or local government level;
- **8 industrial sector** measures, which includes 2 collecting/processing of information and 6 investing measures;
- **9 transport sector** measures which includes planned events at national and municipal level
- **8 energy sector** measures, which is connected to energy transformation, transmission and distribution.



Article 7 of the Energy Efficiency Directive obliges EU Member States to impose the Energy Efficiency Opportunities (EEO) or to achieve the same volumes of energy savings through alternative measures.

Liability schemes obligate energy distribution companies to save at least 1,5% of the energy supplied to the end-users

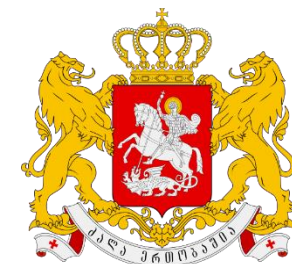


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For member states of Energy Community is determined 0,7% saving each year for end-users by the energy efficiency obligation scheme , from 1 January 2017 to 31 December 2020.

The following alternative measures are assumed in the first National Energy Efficiency Action Plan of Georgia, :

- Creating schemes for financing energy efficiency measures;
- Stimulation of energy efficiency / mandatory increase of energy efficiency in industry;
- Conducting educational (trainings) and advisory programs;
- Developing standards, norms and energy labeling schemes



Article 8 of the Energy Efficiency Directive adopted in 2012 shall comply with all “non-small and medium enterprises” existing in EU Member States: to carry out compulsory energy audits in at least 90% of the property of organizations once in every four years period or or to implement energy management system. (e.g. ISO 50001) relevant to the independent energy management system standards.



The first phase of implementation of compulsory energy audit was on 5th of November 2018.

This event is not expected to be compulsory before last stage of the first National energy Efficiency Action Plan (3 years after the Action Plan is approved)
